The President of the Republic of Kenya, H.E. Dr. William Samoei Ruto, has at the National Productivity and Performance Conference 2026, declared that Kenya's transformation into a First World economy within this generation is inevitable, unstoppable, and irreversible.

While Kenya is yet to realize its full productivity potential the President admits that Kenyans are amongst the most enterprising and ingenious people in the world. The nation's greatest challenge lies in its

systems; these are well within its power to reform and improve.

"We can change, we will change, and we must change," he stated, emphasizing that Kenya's future prosperity rests on this collective resolve to transform and unlock the full potential of its people.

Hosted at the Kenya School of Government (KSG), Lower Kabete Campus from 17-19 June 2026, the Conference resolved to invest in human capital development and institutionalize merit-based systems as key drivers of productivity, competitiveness, and sustainable economic growth.

## Kenya's Pathway to First-World Status

Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service Mr. Felix Kosgei, who is keen on Whole-of-Government approach where Kenya's challenge is to govern productively stated "Government will ultimately be judged not by the number of meetings held, reports produced, or processes completed, but by the improvements citizens experience in their daily lives."

Convened by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission (SRC), the national conference was themed "Productivity for Fiscal Sustainability and Effective Service Delivery."

For Vice Chairperson, SRC, Dr. Gilda Odera, "Productivity is about creating more value with what we have. When institutions embrace accountability, innovation, and performance, every resource works harder, every service improves, and every citizen benefits. "

Delegates at the conference further argued that sustainable growth and competitiveness depend on stronger public-private collaboration, with businesses driving innovation, investment, job creation, and broad economic transformation

To anchor stakeholder commitment to measurable reforms, the Federation of Kenya



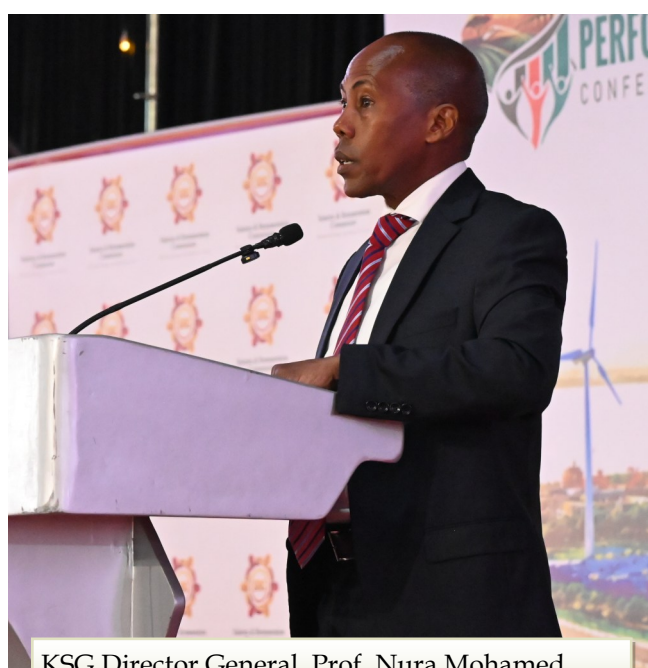

Employers proposed a National Productivity Charter calling for stronger policy frameworks, targeted capacity building, and a clear roadmap toward performance-based systems that drive accountability and results.

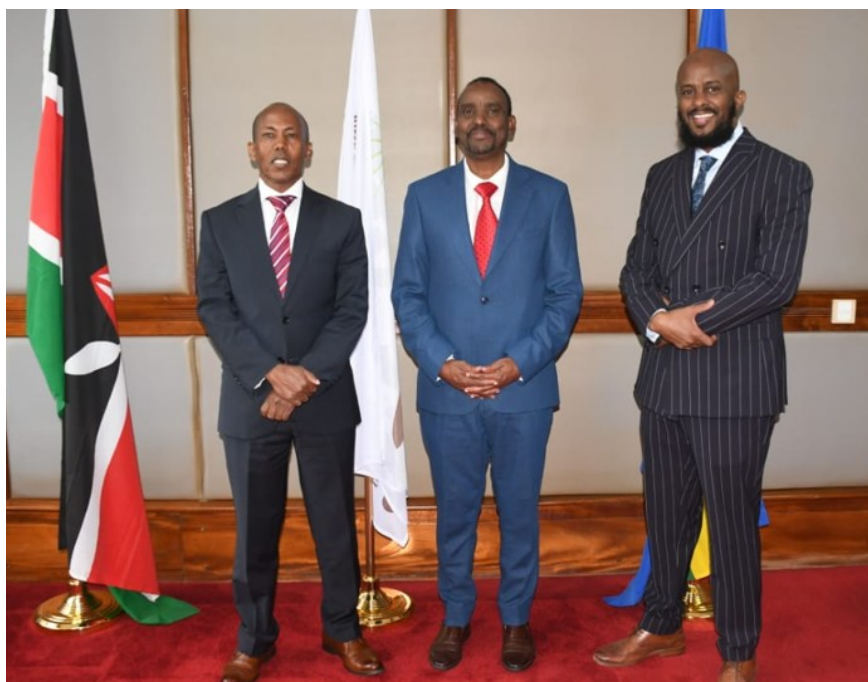
## Somalia Senior Officials at KSG's Executive Leadership Programme

The Kenya School of Government (KSG) has commenced an Executive Leadership Programme for senior officials from the Ministry of Public Works, Reconstruction and Housing of the Federal Government of Somalia.

Aptly themed "Leading Infrastructure Transformation, Urban Development and Institutional Excellence," the programme seeks to strengthen leadership and institutional capacity in public works, infrastructure governance, housing, urban development, professional regulation and inter-agency coordination.

The programme was officially launched at a ceremony graced by KSG Director General Prof. Nura Mohamed; H.E. Hon. Farah Abdinoor Ahmed, Director General, Ministry of Public Works, Reconstruction and Housing, Federal Government of Somalia; and Mr. Adam Stone Diehl, Senior Transport Specialist and Task Team Leader at the World Bank.

In his remarks, Prof. Mohamed stated that leadership is a sacred trust that demands accountability, integrity and a commitment to leaving a positive legacy. He further underscored KSG's collaboration with the Federal Government of Somalia in building capable institutions

and strengthening public-sector leadership.

H.E. Hon. Farah Abdinoor Ahmed emphasized the importance of strengthening institutional capacity, leadership and regional partnerships in advancing Somalia's reconstruction and infrastructure development agenda. He noted that the programme provides participants with an opportunity to gain practical insights from Kenya's experience and apply the lessons to improve public works, urban development and service delivery in Somalia.

Mr. Adam Stone Diehl shared perspectives on the Somalia-Horn of Africa Infrastructure Integration Project, regional infrastructure integration and the World Bank's partnership with Somalia.

engagement, Dr. Tawfiq Bashir, Deputy Director, Embu Campus, observed that Somalia's reconstruction would depend not only on physical infrastructure, but also on the strength of the institutions responsible for planning, regulating and

delivering it.

"Effective infrastructure transformation requires capable, accountable and responsive institutions that can translate national priorities into sustainable results for citizens," Dr. Tawfiq Bashir said.

The programme combines executive learning sessions, institutional engagements, study visits and practical exposure to Kenya's experience in infrastructure development, housing, land administration, urban planning and professional regulation.

Through the programme, participants will exchange experiences, examine innovative approaches and draw practical lessons to support Somalia's reconstruction, improve service delivery and strengthen institutional performance.

The engagement further demonstrates KSG's growing partnership with the Federal Government of Somalia, anchored in regional cooperation, mutual learning and a shared commitment to strengthening public institutions across Africa.

## Beyond Borders: Kenya & Malawi Shaping Public Sector Leadership

When Professor Lewis Baison Dzimbiri stepped onto the grounds of the Kenya School of Government in Mombasa, he was not arriving for a routine workshop. He was leading a delegation from the Malawi School of Government in pursuit of something far more consequential: a new model of African leadership built through partnership rather than isolation.

His visit reflects a broader reality facing governments across the continent. As public institutions work to modernize systems, strengthen accountability, and improve service delivery, the focus has shifted from whether Africa needs stronger leadership to how African institutions can work together to build it.

The Women Executive Leadership Programme: Her Rise

Pink Potential provided a powerful platform for growth and empowerment. Held at the Kenya School of Government (KSG), Mombasa Campus, and facilitated by the Malawi School of Government (MSG), the three-

day initiative convened female executives and high-level practitioners for an engaging experience focused on effective communication, analytical decision-making, leadership in a rapidly evolving digital landscape, environmental stewardship, creativity,

transparency, and transformative public sector management.

In his opening remarks, Professor Dzimhiri stated that “We are committed to developing transformative leaders equipped with the knowledge, skills, and strategic mindset necessary to respond to emerging leadership challenges in today’s dynamic environment” urging the participants to engage fully, share experiences, and build professional networks that would endure long after the programme ended.

Dr. Fred Mukabi, Director KSG Mombasa Campus, framed the partnership in equally strategic terms. “When African institutions learn from one another, we accelerate reform, strengthen public trust, and build the leadership capacity required for sustainable development.” The collaboration, he noted, is designed to move beyond ceremonial cooperation toward practical exchange in governance, training, and institutional management.

Dr. Prisca Oluoch, KSG Director Linkages and Collaborations, emphasized that the partnership marks a shift toward sustained institutional cooperation rather than one-off engagements, describing it as “a pathway for enduring institutional bridges that enable African public service institutions to co-learn, co-create solutions, and strengthen leadership capacity for long-term impact.” She added that such structured collaboration is key to translating shared experiences into practical governance reforms that enhance

service delivery across institutions.

The benefits are tangible as MSG gains access to KSG’s extensive experience in public-sector training, leadership development, and institutional reform. KSG, in turn, expands its regional reach, deepens research and faculty collaboration and strengthens its position as a continental centre for public administration excellence. Joint curriculum development, benchmarking, executive coaching, and future research partnerships are already emerging as areas of mutual interest.

Participants worked on climate-focused action projects, received coaching in professional communication and digital leadership, and developed

accountability commitments for implementation in their home institutions. The Sessions were facilitated by Ms. Sarah Richson and Ms. Weljah Richson.

The week concluded with a gala dinner hosted by KSG Mombasa, celebrating the partnership between the two institutions. More importantly, it strengthened connections among Kenyan and Malawian public servants, fostering collaboration, innovation, and a shared commitment to service.

As the program came to an end, Professor Dzimhiri offered a final reflection: “The future of African governance will be shaped by leaders who are willing to learn beyond borders.” For Kenya and Malawi, that future no longer looks theoretical.

Mr. Marube Nyamiaka's leadership in spearheading this visit sends a powerful message that campus directors and administrators set the tone for institutional culture.

These visits foster stronger social cohesion and nurtures values in the next generation of public servants with a heightened

sense of duty to "leave no one behind" a principle central to Kenya's Vision 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals.

When public officers prioritize community welfare, governance becomes more responsive and equitable. Moreover, these efforts contribute to national development in subtle but profound ways. Stronger communities produce healthier, better-educated citizens who can contribute productively to the economy. Reduced vulnerability among children today translates into lower social costs tomorrow, fewer cases of streetism, juvenile delinquency, or chronic dependency.

On 12 June 2026, at KSG Embu a public lecture was held, exploring the relationship between communication, values, and public trust.

Course participants from Retirement Planning, Public Relations and Customer Care, and the Transformative Leadership programs attended the public lecture delivered by communication expert Mr. Paul J. Oyier from the Media Council of Kenya.

In his opening remarks, Deputy Director Dr. Tawfiq Bashir highlighted the inseparable link between leadership, decision-making, and communication noting that communication reflects the quality of leadership decisions and plays a central role in building trust between institutions and citizens.

Drawing lessons from recent governance experiences, Mr. Oyier observed that many public sector challenges stem not only from policy decisions but also from how those decisions are communicated. He emphasized that transparency, empathy, consistency, and openness are

“Effective communication begins with listening understanding stakeholder concerns, and responding thoughtfully.” He said.

The session further emphasized the importance of aligning words with actions. According to Mr. Oyier, authentic leadership is demonstrated through behavior that reflects institutional values, integrity, and accountability. Public officers were urged to cultivate communication practices that foster credibility and strengthen relationships with the communities they serve.

The lecture also reinforced the significance of citizen engagement in governance. Participants reflected on how leaders can improve service delivery by understanding citizens’ needs and creating meaningful opportunities for dialogue and participation. — *By Judith Bosire*
